Who We Are

Isaiah's Place is a faith-based, non-profit located in Troy, OH, serving children and families in Miami County and across Southwest Ohio. We believe all children and families, regardless of circumstance, deserve the opportunity to heal and thrive. While our roots are in foster care, training and licensing families to care for children from hard places, we have seen a need in our community to expand our services to connect, nurture and restore children and families in multiple ways. Our Child Advocacy Center provides a coordinated response to allegations of child abuse in Miami County, and our Family Coaching program serves families whose children are at risk for removal through in-home, parenting development and education.

Led by the vision of our board, our team is committed to ensuring positive outcomes for all the children and families we serve. These outcomes look like finding permanency for our children in foster care, stabilizing the homes we serve in family coaching, and reducing further victimization and securing timely services for the children aided by the CAC. None of this would be possible without help from our supporters and collaboration with community partners and churches.

Foster Care & Adoption

Train and license foster and adoptive parents to serve children across Southwest Ohio.

Child Advocacy Center (CAC)

A coordinated response to allegations of child abuse in Miami County.

Family Coaching

In-home, parenting development and education aimed at families who are in or near crisis.

Foster Care

In our foster care program, we recruit, train, and license parents to care for children in the foster care system. Working with counties across Southwest Ohio, we place children in foster care in our licensed homes and provide ongoing case management services. At Isaiah's Place, we put an emphasis on supporting our families, because we believe the most therapeutic intervention children can receive is a stable home and relationship with their caregiver. This support takes many forms but can look like our traumafocused training which equips parents to care for children from hard places or the monthly events we host for our families so parents can connect with other foster parents and kids can have fun experiences!

Our hope is that as children come through our agency, they will find permanency, whether it be through reunification with their biological parents or through adoption into a new forever home. In late 2023, we received our adoption certification as an agency, and we look forward to helping families in 2024 on their journey toward adoption.

Child Advocacy Center

Child abuse and neglect is not a new problem for the community of Miami County, Ohio, however up until recently, there has not been a coordinated effort to prevent and respond to these cases. Prior to May 2022, this community lacked a collaborative response from the mandated investigators responsible for managing these cases.

In response to a sharp increase in child abuse cases and a realization there was a better way to respond and intervene with victims of child abuse, the Child Advocacy Center at Isaiah's Place was formed. The CAC ensures children in Miami County receive prompt and specialized services when there are allegations of abuse. The offers а neutral and environment where children come to be interviewed one time by a specially trained forensic interviewer and receive services to help begin the healing process.

Family Coaching

In the Fall of 2023, we were able to launch a new prevention program aimed at family preservation, family coaching. Through our partnership with the Miami County Family and Children First Council, we are connected with families whose children are at risk for removal. Our Family Coach works with parents and children to promote the well-being and stability of the family by providing in-home, practical parenting development and education aimed at families who are in or near crisis. In the last couple months of 2023, we were able to serve 8 families, and we're looking forward to working with many more in 2024.
